Academic Integrity Policy Declaration**

As an International Baccalaureate School, the Liceum Ogólnokształcące nr V supports and promotes the principles of properly conducted academic research and the respect for integrity in all forms of assessment. This means that all candidates accept academic integrity as “a guiding principle in education and a choice to act in a responsible way whereby others can have trust in them as individuals.”

The IB defines malpractice as “behaviour that results in, or may result in, the candidate or any other candidate gaining an unfair advantage in one or more components of assessment. Academic misconduct is a breach of these regulations and includes, but is not restricted to, the following:

1. **Plagiarism** – this is defined as the representation, intentionally or unintentionally, of the ideas, words or work of another person without proper, clear and explicit acknowledgment.
2. **Collusion** – this is defined as supporting academic misconduct by another candidate, for example, allowing one’s work to be copied or submitted for assessment by another.
3. **Duplication of work** – this is defined as the presentation of the same work for different assessment components and/or DP core requirements.
4. **Misconduct during an IB examinations** (for example, taking unauthorized material into an examination, behavior that disrupts the examination or distracts other candidates, or communicating with another candidate).
5. **Any other behavior** that gains an unfair advantage for a candidate or that affects the results of another candidate (for example, cheating, falsifying a CAS record, disclosure of information to and receipt of information from candidates about the content of an examination paper within 24 hours after a written examination via any form of communication/media) (see: *Academic Integrity*, IB 2019; *General Regulations: Diploma Programme*, IB 2014).

A student who has been found guilty of academic misconduct in any of these forms, will be subject to penalties described in Academic Integrity Policy.

If the submitted work does not follow the principles of academic integrity and constitutes a part of an official IB coursework, it will not be accepted. Time permitting, a student will be given one more chance to re-submit it. If there is no time to produce an original piece of work, a student will have a grade F entered into IBIS and thus will not receive a diploma.

Any breach of regulations during the final examinations will be unfailingly reported to IB.
